Count I. Robbery 1st Degree (569.020-001Y19791207.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 569.020, RSMo, committed the class A felony of robbery in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about October 12, 2016, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant acting alone or in concert with others forcibly stole a wallet owned by Luis Cedres, and in the course thereof the defendant armed with a deadly weapon.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about October 12, 2016, in the county of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Robbery in the First Degree charged in Count I, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony

of Robbery in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years.

Count III. Burglary 1st Degree (569.160-001Y19792202.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 569.160, RSMo, committed the class B felony of burglary in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about October 12, 2016, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly entered unlawfully in a building, located at 1716 SW Parkridge Dr., Blue Springs MO and possessed by Luis Cedres, for the purpose of committing stealing therein, and while in such building the defendant was armed with a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years.

Count IX. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about October 12, 2016, in the county of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Burglary in the First Degree charged in Count III, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Burglary in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years.

Count V. Murder 2nd Degree (565.021-001Y19840903.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the class A felony of murder in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about October 12, 2016, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, Luis Cedres was killed by being shot as a result of the perpetration or immediate flight from the perpetration of the class felony of B of Burglary in the First Degree committed by the defendant on or about October 12, 2016.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count VI. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about October 12, 2016, in the county of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of murder in the second degree charged in Count V, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Burglary in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

I, **Det. Kevin Lange** a police officer with the Blue Springs Police Department knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true.

1.) I have probable cause to believe that on **Wednesday, October 12, 2016**, at **1716 SW Parkridge Drive, Blue Springs, Jackson County, Missouri 64015**, **Malik S. Duren B/M 06-15-1999**, SSN [REDACTED], of **3762 Wayne, Kansas City, Mo 64109** committed one or more criminal offense(s).

2.) The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

That on Wednesday, October 12, 2016, at approximately 0035 hours, three black males unlawfully entered the residence of 1716 SW Parkridge Drive after the victim, **Luis A. Cedres B/M 08-04-1970**, had unlocked the door because someone had knocked on the door.

Victim #2, [REDACTED] W/F 01-12-1998 and victim #3, [REDACTED] B/M 08-04-1998, said they were upstairs when three black males armed with handguns entered the apartment and two of the black males went upstairs and the third black male engaged Mr. Cedres. The two who went upstairs were wearing masks and their faces covered by bandanas. While one of the suspects was demanding money from victims #2-3, Mr. [REDACTED] recognized one of the suspect's face and his voice as "Mahki Hall". Mr. [REDACTED] said to the one black male suspect, you're "Mahki", I know you because I went to school with you, "Mahki". Mahki then pulled down his bandana, exposing his face and replied, "Shut up or I'll shoot you in the face". Mahki and the other suspect took Mr. [REDACTED]'s cell phone and wallet and Ms. [REDACTED]'s makeup bag and cell phone.

Ms. [REDACTED] who was hiding in the closet could hear her boyfriend, Mr. [REDACTED] saying, "You're Mahki, I know you".

Mr. [REDACTED] is unsure if the shots he heard where inside or outside of the apartment. He did not think Mr. Cedres was armed with any type of weapon.

At one point the deceased victim, Mr. Cedres went outside the apartment and was later found deceased in the parking lot.

Blue Springs Police Officers observed a dark colored vehicle, a 2007 Suzuki Forenza 4-door, UL6-E7K Mo17, traveling from the scene at a high rate of speed northbound on M-7 Highway and eventually stopped the vehicle north of Pink Hill Road at which time two black males' suspects fled on foot. A third black male, **Malik Duren**, was found to be shot and was transported to Center Point Medical Center. At the hospital, Blue Springs Police Officer Sterling Belknap recovered Mr. Cedres' wallet on Mr. Duren's person.

After a search warrant was obtained for the suspect vehicle, a green 1997 Honda Accord, VIN (Vehicle Identification Number) 1HGCD5633VA274098. This vehicle was last registered to [REDACTED]. The license plate displayed on the vehicle was UL6-E7K Mo17, which registered to a Maya M. Duren B/F 06-06-1997, of 4235 College Ave, Kansas City, Mo, on a 2007 Suzuki Forenza 4-door. Inside the vehicle, Ms. [REDACTED]'s wallet and cell phone was located. Investigators also recovered Mr. [REDACTED] wallet and cell phone along with Mahki Hall's wallet.

At 0625 hours, both Ms [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] responded to the station and Det. Kevin Lange showed Mr. [REDACTED] a Missouri Department of Revenue photo of Mr. Hall with no names attached to the photograph and he immediately said without any hesitation, "Yes, that's Mahki".

With the assistance of Department of Public Safety for the Blue Springs School District they checked Mr. Hall through their system and advised that his father lives at 33109 E. Truman Road, Grain Valley, Mo and that was the direction officers had been tracking the suspects from M-7 Highway and Pink Hill Road.

Det. Lange notified the Jackson County Sheriff Department who responded to the address and Mr. Hall voluntarily came outside. Once outside Mr. Hall was detained and transported to Blue Springs Police Department headquarters for an interview.

After being Mirandized, Mr. Hall did admit that he and his cousins, Malik and [REDACTED] on Tuesday morning (October 11, 2016) had planned to rob Mr. [REDACTED] because he sold weed (marijuana) out of his residence and assumed he had money.

Mahki said all three went to the apartment and were armed with a .40cal and a .45cal handguns, then he and [REDACTED] had went upstairs while Malik took the victim, Mr. Cedres outside. Mahki said they heard gunshots so [REDACTED] went downstairs as Malik was attempting to re-enter the apartment and was shot by [REDACTED]

All three returned to the suspect car and while fleeing, they tossed the all three handguns out around M-7 Highway & Pink Hill Road.


A witness, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was returning home in the 1700 block of SW Parkridge drive when he saw two men fighting in the parking near "1716", one male wearing a gray hoodie and blue jeans had the victim, Mr. Cedres in a head lock. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said he heard a muffled sound and then the male with the hoodie pointed a gun at him so he took off running. Mr [REDACTED] then heard three more shots.

Per Blue Springs Police Officer Sterling Belknap statements, when he stopped the suspect vehicle, Mr. Duren was wearing a gray hoodie, blue jeans and a black t-shirt. Mr. Duren was suffering a gunshot wound in the left armpit area.
