COMPLAINT WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Domestic Assault - 2nd Degree (565.073-003Y20171306.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.073, RSMo, committed the class D felony of domestic assault in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly caused physical injury to by striking in the face with his fist, and ... and defendant were family or household members in that and the defendant were persons who had been in a continuing social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature.

The range of punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than two (2) years and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count II. Domestic Assault - 3rd Degree (565.074-003Y20171304.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.074, RSMo, committed the class E felony of domestic assault in the third degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly caused physical pain to by striking in the back, and and defendant were family or household members in that and the defendant were persons who had been in a continuing social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature.

The range of punishment for a class E felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than two (2) years and not to exceed four (4) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count III. Domestic Assault - 2nd Degree (565.073-003Y20171306.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.073, RSMo, committed the **class D felony of domestic assault in the second degree**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly caused physical injury to by striking in the face with a piece of glass, and and defendant were family or household members in that and the defendant were persons who had been in a continuing social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature.

The range of punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than two (2) years and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count IV. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/from Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building, Resulting In Death Or Injury (571.030-015Y20145213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.030, RSMo, committed the **class A Felony of unlawful use of a weapon**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 571.030.9, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, at 5311 Oakleaf Drive, #3, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting

alone or purposefully in concert with another, knowingly discharged a firearm at a motor vehicle, a white Ford Focus, and as a result of the above described suffered injury.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count V. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, either acting alone or purposefully in concert with another, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon, charged in Count 4, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five (5) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count VI. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/from Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building (571.030-020Y20145213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.030, RSMo, either acting alone or purposefully in concert with another, committed the **class B Felony of**

unlawful use of a weapon, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 571.030.9, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, at 5311 Oakleaf Drive, #3, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, knowingly discharged a firearm at a motor vehicle, a gray Pontiac G6.

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years. Pursuant to Section 571.030.9, RSMo, for the first violation a person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony; for any violation by a prior offender as defined in Section 558.016, RSMo, a person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony without the possibility of parole, probation, or conditional release for a term of ten (10) years; and for any violation by a persistent offender as defined in Section 558.016, RSMo, a person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony without the possibility of parole, probation, or conditional release.

Count VII. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon, charged in Count 6, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five (5) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count VIII. Domestic Assault 1st Degree - 1st Offense (565.072-002Y19991304.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.072, RSMo, committed the **class B felony of domestic assault in the first degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or purposefully in concert with another, shot and such conduct was a substantial step toward the commission of the offense of domestic assault in the first degree of and was done for the purpose of committing such assault, and and defendant were family or household members in that and the defendant were persons who had been in a continuing social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years.

Count IX. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, either acting alone or purposefully in concert with another, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Domestic Assault charged in Count 9, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Domestic Assault by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five (5) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to

any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count X. Assault - 2nd Degree (565.052-001Y20171304.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.052, RSMo, committed the **class D felony of assault in the second degree**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant attempted to cause physical injury to by means of a deadly weapon by striking with a firearm.

The range of punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than two (2) years and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count XI. Unlawful Possession Of A Firearm (571.070-001Y20175212.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.070, RSMo, committed the **class D felony of unlawful possession of a firearm**, punishable under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 4, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly possessed a 9mm handgun, a firearm, and on September 18, 2018, the defendant was convicted of the felony of Tampering with a Motor Vehicle in Jackson County case number 1816-CR02385-01.

The range of punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than two (2) years and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.


Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

Detectives of the Kansas City Missouri Police Department responded to Research Hospital Brookside and contacted who stated the following: She had dated **De'andre D. HOOKER B/M 02-04-1999** for approximately 4 years, and he had choked her in the past. Today, she was at the apartment complex gym (Maple Hill apartments) with a friend when **HOOKER** came into the gym upset about texts she had sent her sister. **HOOKER** pushed her, and punched her in the face twice with a closed fist. Teported that **HOOKER's** friends, one she knew as Rayquan and another she did not know, got **HOOKER** off of her. Pulled out her phone to call her mother, and **HOOKER** snatched her phone away. He hit her again, and continued striking her as they walked out of the gym into their apartment (5311 Oakleaf Dr #3), including punching her in the lower back. Inside the apartment he broke a lamp, picked up a piece of glass from the lamp, and hit her in the face with it. The arrived and the got into that vehicle (2003 white Ford Focus bearing TX license CTF4794, VIN: 1FAFP34ZX3W238493). HOOKER stood in front of the apartment complex and shot into the vehicle an unknown number of times. At this point was grazed on the right side of her head. She exited

the vehicle, and got into her sister s vehicle (2005 gray Pontiac G6, bearing MO license KP2N0L, VIN: 1G2ZG528854135783). As they were leaving the apartment complex, HOOKER shot into the vehicle again. advised her nephew was a passenger in the Pontiac G6 as well. He had exited the vehicle and walked toward HOOKER and the other two suspects, but did not see what happened after that. He got back in the car and drove them to a nearby gas station, then got out to go back and check on then drove to the hospital. Stated HOOKER had two other males with him, but only HOOKER was shooting.
was also contacted at the hospital and stated the following: This evening he was with his aunt who had gotten a message from a friend of his other aunt to help with her boyfriend. knew boyfriend's first name was Deandre and had seen him regularly. He identified HOOKER from a single DOR photograph. When and arrived at the apartment complex, he saw HOOKER and his cousins coming out. They prepared to fight and HOOKER punched him in the face with a closed fist, while his cousin struck him in the back of the head with a black Glock, and also in the shoulder, possibly with the gun. had his head down when he heard multiple shots, so he did not know who was shooting. indicated that had a handgun in her possession, but did not point it at anyone. Tran behind a nearby car and jumped into out he drove the rest of the way to the hospital.
stated the following: She had responded to meet her sister with her mother and nephew and waited in the car while went inside. When came out with , got into a fight with HOOKER and his cousins who were following and toward their cars. As fled to ''s car, HOOKER and his cousins began shooting at their cars. exited Man's car and got into fled through the complex and saw HOOKER again in the area of Hickory Rd and Persimmon Trail (in the complex), and he shot at her again. She drove through grass and escaped to a nearby store, where she got out and let are drive to the hospital so that she could return and check on
stated the following: She had responded to get her daughter
A neighbor was contacted on scene. She stated she heard what she thought was fireworks, and saw two black males running northbound through the apartments. Her vehicle (2013 blue Toyota Camry bearing MO license XB6Z9U, VIN: 4T1BD1FK0DU078087) sustained a bullet hole damaging the rear windshield.
Medical records revealed the following injuries and observations for graze wound to the right side of the head; bruising left mastoid area with diffuse tenderness; periorbital swelling, tenderness and edema to the right eye; facial swelling along right periorbital and bridge of nose with bruising across midface; mid and low tenderness to the neck/muscle area; tachycardia; diffuse bruising and tenderness in thoracic area of back.

Medical records revealed s injuries to consist of facial and scalp contusions and a shoulder strain.
A stop order was issued for HOOKER on 08-04-2019. On 08-27-2019, HOOKER was taken into custody for his stop order (see KCPD CRN 19-65014). At the time of his arrest, a 9 mm handgun was found underneath the seat of a vehicle which HOOKER had just exited. The handgun was found underneath the front passenger seat where HOOKER had been sitting. Detectives of the Kansas City Missouri Police Department responded to East Patrol Detention and read HOOKER his Miranda rights. HOOKER stated the following: On 08-04-2019 he was at 5311 Oak Leaf Dr, Apt #3, where he resided with his girlfriend They argued, punched him, and he began "pushing her around, making her fuck herself up." It is face struck the table and her head struck the couch. Her mother arrived and took outside with her. HOOKER went outside with his cousins and and confronted first and HOOKER punched him in the face. After they started fighting, he saw shoot out of her vehicle and he shot back. They exchanged gunfire and fell out of the car. He then stated he only shot at the ground and not at the vehicle, and stated it was "self-defense." He admitted he was on probation, served 6-7 months in prison, and could not legally possess the firearm. He consented to a buccal swab for DNA.
On 09-18-2018, Jackson County Circuit Court convicted HOOKER of two felonies: tampering with a motor vehicle in the 1 st degree, and resisting arrest by fleeing causing substantial risk of serious injury (1816CR0238501). He is currently on probation for stolen property and tampering with a motor vehicle in the 1 st degree through Probation and Parole District 4.
On 5-9-18, Jackson County Circuit Court convicted HOOKER of the felony of tampering with a motor vehicle in the 1 st degree in case number 1716-CR00502-01. He is currently on probation for that offense.
The defendant is also on probation for theft and criminal damage in Wyandotte County, KS case 18CR789, with a 39 month underlying sentence.
A warrant is requested for HOOKER and a bond is requested to be associated with that bond based upon the following factors: his history of violence, including domestic violence assaults against different victims (KCPD CRN 18-31566, 19-22401); the severity of this offense, in which he shot and shot at two vehicles occupied by 4 victims in total; and his use of a firearm which he is restricted from possessing.
