WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/from Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building (571.030-020Y20145213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.030, RSMo, committed the **class B Felony of unlawful use of a weapon**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 571.030.9, RSMo, in that on or about January 3, 2020, at 1013 SW Speas Drive, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or purposefully in concert with another, knowingly discharged a firearm at a habitable structure known as 1013 SW Speas Drive, Blue Springs, Mo 64014.

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about January 3, 2020, in the County of Jackson, State of

Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon charged in Count 1, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference,

and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count III. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/from Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building (571.030-020Y20145213.0)

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The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

State vs. Chance D Boles

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The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years.

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The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

DATE: 01-08-2020	Blue Springs Police Case Number	2020-000165
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I, **Det. Kevin Lange** a police officer with the Blue Springs Police Department knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true.

1.) I have probable cause to believe that on **January 3, 2020**, at **1013 SW Speas Drive, Blue Springs, Jackson County, Mo 64014, Chance D. Boles B/M 09-16-2000, [REDACTED], of 12813 Bristol Ave, Grandview, Mo 64030** and **Atianna J. Chavez W/F 11-28-2001, XXX-XX-2554, 12813 Bristol Ave, Grandview, Mo 64030** committed one or more criminal offense(s).

2.) The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On Friday, January 3, 2020 at approximately 1955 hours, [REDACTED] was sitting on her couch inside of her residence when she heard three to four shot ring out then hit the house. [REDACTED] looked outside but did not see any suspects. [REDACTED] was not injured.

Blue Springs Police Officer responded and was able to locate two shell casings in the street and three bullet holes in the residence. The residence which is located on the west side of Speas Drive and faces the east had a bullet hole in the east entry storm door. Another bullet hole was found by the bedroom window north of the front door. A third bullet hole was located to the left (south) side of the single car garage. Officer Kesler photographed the damage and recovered the evidence.

[REDACTED] brother [REDACTED] had responded to the residence advising he had received threats from Chance Boles who had threatened to come to the residence to shot at him. [REDACTED] said this was an ongoing feud between the two.

On Saturday, January 4, 2020, Mr. Boles sent [REDACTED] a SnapChat audio recording stating, "Listen little nigga, first off I only shot three times 'cause I know (inaudible). Second off nigga you really don't want to go there bro, I sent the address, stop talking, you pull up bro. I pulled up and shot your shit up, now what are you gonna do about it? As of now you not doing shit, you sitting back and talking to a nigga that tried to end your family's life bitch."

On Tuesday, January 7, 2020, [REDACTED] contacted the Blue Springs Police Department because he was receiving text messages from Mr. Boles indicating he was coming back to the residence to shoot it up again. Officer Brandon ShROUT contacted the home owner, [REDACTED] who was leaving and advised no one was home. A short time later at 1034 hours, a "shots fired" was broadcasted at 1013 SW Speas Drive. Reference Property Damage 2020-000165.

A witness described two subjects standing out in the middle of Speas Drive, firing southbound into the residence of "1013", the casually walk northbound towards the intersection of Speas Drive and Windsor Court where a silver in color vehicle was parked facing northbound. The suspects entered the vehicle and drove northbound on Speas Drive.

The witness described one suspect as a black male, the second, possibly a female who was small and dressed in all black.

Det. Martin Kreisler and myself (Det. Kevin Lange) responded to the crime scene area, (17) shell casings were recovered in the street and I photographed the crime scene and collected the shell casings. SVU (Special Victim's Unit) detectives collected the spent rounds within the residence.

Lee's Summit Police Department Det. Michael Reese contacted me advising they had a drive by shooting listing Mr. Boles as a suspect also. This shooting occurred on Monday, January 6, 2020, at approximately 0947 hours, reference Assault 2020-000147. The second suspect was identified as Mr. Boles girlfriend, Atianna Chavez.

Lee's Summit Police Department was able to obtain search warrants for Mr. Boles cell phone and residence. The warrant was served, Mr. Boles and Ms. Chavez was detained along with two other subjects.

While on scene Ms. Chavez voluntarily agreed to go to Lee's Summit Police Department for an interview. Det. Reese and I transported her to Lee's Summit Police Department Headquarters. Once in the interview, Ms. Chavez was unhandcuffed and Det. Reese read Ms. Chavez her Miranda Warning in which she agreed to talk.

After explaining to Ms. Chavez the facts that we had, she confessed to driving her boyfriend, Mr. Boles of three years to [REDACTED] parent's house in her silver 2005 Lexus so he could shoot at the house on Friday night.

Ms. Chavez said that she drove Mr. Boles back to [REDACTED] parent's residence on Tuesday morning so they both could shoot at [REDACTED] residence. Ms. Chavez said she was only able to fire off only one round from her .380 because it jammed. She said Mr. Boles fired off at least (15) rounds from his 9mm.

Ms. Chavez also described in detail how she drove Mr. Boles to the residence in Lee's Summit, Mo and how she got to fire off at least four or five rounds before her gun jammed and Mr. Boles fired the remaining rounds from his 9mm.

Ms. Chavez said the reason she was shooting at both the residences is because she enjoys shooting her gun, kind of gives her a adrenaline high.

Ms. Chavez said after the shooting of [REDACTED] residence, they decided to hide their guns at a friend's house in Kansas City, Mo. Lee's Summit Police Department and Kansas City Police Department were able to recover those firearms.

Mr. Boles was Mirandized by Det. Reese in a separate interview but denied any involvement. Mr. Boles did admit that he was a member of the "Bloods", the "Pyro" set, but is no longer a hitman for them.

3.) I believe that defendant poses a danger to a crime victim because they used a firearm to shoot into a residence twice with no regard for the victim's safety.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

LSPD Complaint: 20-174

Date: January 8th, 2020

I, Detective James Treacy, an investigator with the Lee's Summit, Missouri Department of Police, upon my oath, and under penalties of perjury, state as follows:

1. I have probable cause to believe that on 1/06/2020, Chance D. Boles, B/M, 9/16/2000, XXX-XX-2459, at 1901 SE 7th St., Lee's Summit, Missouri, Jackson County Missouri, committed one or more criminal offenses.
2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 6 January 2020, Patrol Officer M. Knowles was dispatched to the area of Southeast Cumberland Drive and Southeast Shenandoah Drive, Lee's Summit, Jackson County, Missouri on reported drive-by shooting that occurred at 1901 Southeast 7th Street, Lee's Summit, Jackson County, Missouri 64063.

Officer M. Knowles arrived on scene and noticed a black GMC Denali, parked in the driveway of 1901 Southeast 7th Street, which had holes in the rear passenger side window and rear passenger door. Officer M. Knowles contacted the homeowner at the address, who was identified as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] explained to Officer Knowles and Detectives on scene, that she was in her bathroom, getting ready to take a shower when the glass door to the shower, suddenly shattered. She stated she heard "fireworks" and dropped to the floor in her Master Bedroom closet. She heard a vehicle, outside the residence, leave the residence and she went to check on her two children, who were also inside the residence. [REDACTED] stated she does not have any drama, however has four teenage boys who live at the residence.

Detectives processed the scene for evidence and located seventeen (17) spent (fired), 9mm casings, two (2) spent (fired), .380 casings and one (1) live .380 round laying in the street to the west of the residence. Eight (8) bullet holes were located on the west side of the residence and four (4) bullet holes in the GMC Denali. One (1) bullet hole was located in a neighbor's residence, at 1904 Southeast 7th Street.

Officers contacted construction workers in a construction office on the southeast corner of Southeast Shenandoah Drive and Southeast Cumberland Drive. One (1) of the witnesses stated he was sitting in his office, when he heard the sound of shots being fired. The witness got up and looked out the window of the trailer. He noticed a male (unknown race), wearing a "light gray hoodie" standing in the road across the street. The witness said the male had his right arm raised in the air; however, he could not tell if anything was in his hand. The male turned toward the witness and moved like he got into a vehicle; however, it was hidden from view by a tree at the entrance to the neighborhood. A moment later a gray colored, four (4) door sedan "took off."

A second witness was contacted who stated he was inside his work building when he heard, what sounded like gunshots, outside. He exited the office trailer and saw a silver colored Lexus facing west on Southeast Shenandoah Drive. He got into his vehicle and started to follow the suspect vehicle as it traveled west on Southeast Shenandoah Drive. He provided a Missouri license plate of "ZE4 V4U" and said the vehicle was a silver colored Lexus 330. The vehicle traveled to US 50 Highway and accelerated to approximately eighty-five miles per hour (85 mph). The witness was not comfortable following the suspect vehicle and exited onto Missouri 291 Highway as the suspect vehicle continued west on US 50 Highway.

A check of the Missouri license plate ZE4 V4U showed the license plate registered to:

Stacie Chavez TOD (transfer on death to) Atianna Chavez
12813 Bristol Avenue, Grandview, Missouri
Vehicle: 2005 Lexus 330

While on scene at the victim's residence, Detectives contacted one (1) of [REDACTED] juvenile sons who provided information about a female on Snapchat, who he believed to be involved. The female's name was "Atianna" and the Snapchat handle is "atiee39." The juvenile son then provided a Snapchat conversation he was provided from Snapchat handle "My Brother Sir." The conversation showed a picture of the Snapchat name "Chance," with a Snapchat handle of "chancethegod1." The following is the messages from "chancethegod1:"

- "He told me to pull up"
- "I asked for (appeared to be an emoji of a gas pump)"
- "That nigga said bring Sean (23 emojis of a crying-laughing emoji)"
- "He said korey got his addy"

Detectives contacted Grandview, Missouri, Police Department in an attempt to identify Chance. Grandview Police Department stated they had located a male named Chance, who was associated to the same address listed on the registration of the suspect vehicle. They provided the name of Chance Boles [REDACTED], DOB: 16 September 2000). A check of Chance's Missouri Department of Revenue entry showed him to have an address of 12813 Bristol Avenue, Grandview, Missouri, which was the same address that the suspect vehicle was registered to as well.

Detectives interviewed [REDACTED], who is one of [REDACTED] sons. He was not present during the incident; however, stated his brother "Sean" had attempted to buy some "weed," on 5 January 2020, from Chance's girlfriend, Atianna. Sean talked to Atianna through text messages. Sean told Atianna he wanted to see the weed and Atianna told Sean, "pussy ass, you know what it looks like, you always hit me asking what it looks like." Sean responded to Atianna that she needed "to go get your pussy checked." Atianna told Chance what Sean had said to her and made Chance upset. [REDACTED] stated that Chance and Atianna lived together and they drove either a silver

colored Lexus or a white colored Equinox. [REDACTED] described Chance as a skinny black male, with "dreads." [REDACTED] stated he always rides passenger and keeps a gun under his seat and one in his pocket. Later [REDACTED] positively identified Chance as Chance Boles from his Missouri Department of Revenue photograph taken for his issued driver license.

An interview was then conducted with [REDACTED], [REDACTED] eldest son. He stated he contacted Atianna Chavez, through Snapchat, yesterday on 5 January 2020 to buy some weed. He knew Atianna because they attended high school together. They got into an argument about him wanting a picture of the "weed." [REDACTED] then contacted Chance, to buy some "weed" and sent a message to him stating, "cuz yo girl is trippin." Chance sent him an image of "4 nuggs" and [REDACTED] told Chance he was "good." Chance responded to Sean that he was going to "pull up" since he did not like the way he was talking to his girlfriend. On 6 January 2020 Chance texted him; however, he could not remember what he said. [REDACTED] thought he ended the text conversation without any problems; however, at 9:34 AM, he received a Snapchat message from Chance, which showed the barrel of a gun, pointing at the front of [REDACTED]'s residence. [REDACTED] later received a Snapchat message from Chance with stated, "go check yo house." [REDACTED] provided screenshots of the Snapchat messages he received from Chance's account.

On Monday, 6 January 2020 Detective J. Treacy issued a Person of Interest for the suspect, Chance Boles, and the suspect vehicle, 2005 Lexus 330.

On Tuesday, 7 January 2020 the Lee's Summit Police Department requested assistance from various agencies to help look for the suspect, including the Grandview Police Department. Two Detective with the Grandview Police Department were staged near the suspect's residence at 12813 Bristol Avenue. They observed the suspect, C. Boles, driving the suspect vehicle, 2005 Lexus 330 with license plate ZE4 V4U, up to the residence located at 12813 Bristol Avenue. C. Boles parked the vehicle inside the garage which was attached to the residence. Later on, the Grandview Detectives watched C. Boles exit the residence and leave in another vehicle.

A search warrant was served at the residence and the following items were located:

- One box of Tulammo .380 ammunition, containing 8 rounds
- Box of .380 ammunition, containing 9 various rounds of .380 ammunition
- One spent .380 shell casing

During the search warrant service, Atianna Chavez was detained. Detectives requested she respond to Police Headquarters to provide a statement.

Detective Reese conducted an interview with Atianna. During the interview, she confessed to shooting approximately 5 rounds into the residence. She also stated that Chance shot approximately 15 rounds into the residence. Atianna explained the firearms used in the shooting were placed into the trunk of the Pontiac at Dre Shelby's residence.

An interview with Chance was conducted. He denied any knowledge of the shooting incident, however stated his Snapchat handle is "chancethegod1."

Detectives later located [REDACTED] residence through Missouri DOR and photographed the residence and Pontiac sitting near the residence. The photograph was later provided to Atianna, who positively identified the Pontiac as the vehicle she placed the firearms into.

Detectives conducted surveillance on Andre Shelby's residence and noticed one black male inside the vehicle. The black male took a bag out of the vehicle and eventually entered a Nissan parked in the street. A car stop was conducted on the Nissan and consent was later granted to search the vehicle. A purple Nike bag containing a Chiappa .22 caliber handgun and a 9mm Beretta were recovered. Also recovered was a red Chiefs backpack, containing a .380 caliber Bersa Firestorm with drum magazine.

Ms. Chavez said she was only able to fire off only one round from her .380 because it jammed. She said Mr. Boles fired off at least (15) rounds from his 9mm.

Ms. Chavez also described in detail how she drove Mr. Boles to the residence in Lee's Summit, Mo and how she got to fire off at least four or five rounds before her gun jammed and Mr. Boles fired the remaining rounds from his 9mm.

Ms. Chavez said the reason she was shooting at both the residences is because she enjoys shooting her gun, kind of gives her a adrenaline high.

Ms. Chavez said after the shooting of [REDACTED] residence, they decided to hide their guns at a friend's house in Kansas City, Mo. Lee's Summit Police Department and Kansas City Police Department were able to recover those firearms.

Mr. Boles was Mirandized by Det. Reese in a separate interview but denied any involvement. Mr. Boles did admit that he was a member of the "Bloods", the "Pyro" set, but is no longer a hitman for them.

3.) I believe that defendant poses a danger to a crime victim because they used a firearm to shoot into a residence twice with no regard for the victim's safety.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

LSPD Complaint: 20-174

Date: January 8th, 2020

I, Detective James Treacy, an investigator with the Lee's Summit, Missouri Department of Police, upon my oath, and under penalties of perjury, state as follows:

1. I have probable cause to believe that on 1/06/2020, **Atianna J. Chavez, W/F, 11/28/2001, XXX-XX-2554**, at **1901 SE 7th St., Lee's Summit**, Missouri, Jackson County Missouri, committed one or more criminal offenses.
2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 6 January 2020, Patrol Officer M. Knowles was dispatched to the area of Southeast Cumberland Drive and Southeast Shenandoah Drive, Lee's Summit, Jackson County, Missouri on reported drive-by shooting that occurred at 1901 Southeast 7th Street, Lee's Summit, Jackson County, Missouri 64063.

Officer M. Knowles arrived on scene and noticed a black GMC Denali, parked in the driveway of 1901 Southeast 7th Street, which had holes in the rear passenger side window and rear passenger door. Officer M. Knowles contacted the homeowner at the address, who was identified as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] explained to Officer Knowles and Detectives on scene, that she was in her bathroom, getting ready to take a shower when the glass door to the shower, suddenly shattered. She stated she heard "fireworks" and dropped to the floor in her Master Bedroom closet. She heard a vehicle, outside the residence, leave the residence and she went to check on her two children, who were also inside the residence. [REDACTED] stated she does not have any drama, however has four teenage boys who live at the residence.

Detectives processed the scene for evidence and located seventeen (17) spent (fired), 9mm casings, two (2) spent (fired), .380 casings and one (1) live .380 round laying in the street to the west of the residence. Eight (8) bullet holes were located on the west side of the residence and four (4) bullet holes in the GMC Denali. One (1) bullet hole was located in a neighbor's residence, at 1904 Southeast 7th Street.

Officers contacted construction workers in a construction office on the southeast corner of Southeast Shenandoah Drive and Southeast Cumberland Drive. One (1) of the witnesses stated he was sitting in his office, when he heard the sound of shots being fired. The witness got up and looked out the window of the trailer. He noticed a male (unknown race), wearing a "light gray hoodie" standing in the road across the street. The witness said the male had his right arm raised in the air; however, he could not tell if anything was in his hand. The male turned toward the witness and moved like he got into a vehicle; however, it was hidden from view by a tree at the entrance to the neighborhood. A moment later a gray colored, four (4) door sedan "took off."

A second witness was contacted who stated he was inside his work building when he heard, what sounded like gunshots, outside. He exited the office trailer and saw a silver colored Lexus facing west on Southeast Shenandoah Drive. He got into his vehicle and started to follow the suspect vehicle as it traveled west on Southeast Shenandoah Drive. He provided a Missouri license plate of "ZE4 V4U" and said the vehicle was a silver colored Lexus 330. The vehicle traveled to US 50 Highway and accelerated to approximately eighty-five miles per hour (85 mph). The witness was not comfortable following the suspect vehicle and exited onto Missouri 291 Highway as the suspect vehicle continued west on US 50 Highway.

A check of the Missouri license plate ZE4 V4U showed the license plate registered to:

Stacie Chavez TOD (transfer on death to) Atianna Chavez
12813 Bristol Avenue, Grandview, Missouri
Vehicle: 2005 Lexus 330

While on scene at the victim's residence, Detectives contacted one (1) of [REDACTED] juvenile sons who provided information about a female on Snapchat, who he believed to be involved. The female's name was "Atianna" and the Snapchat handle is "atiee39." The juvenile son then provided a Snapchat conversation he was provided from Snapchat handle "My Brother Sir." The conversation showed a picture of the Snapchat name "Chance," with a Snapchat handle of "chancecthegod1." The following is the messages from "chancecthegod1:"

- "He told me to pull up"
- "I asked for (appeared to be an emoji of a gas pump)"
- "That nigga said bring Sean (23 emojis of a crying-laughing emoji)"
- "He said korey got his addy"

Detectives contacted Grandview, Missouri, Police Department in an attempt to identify Chance. Grandview Police Department stated they had located a male named Chance, who was associated to the same address listed on the registration of the suspect vehicle. They provided the name of Chance Boles (SSN: XXX-XX-2459, DOB: 16 September 2000). A check of Chance's Missouri Department of Revenue entry showed him to have an address of 12813 Bristol Avenue, Grandview, Missouri, which was the same address that the suspect vehicle was registered to as well.

Detectives interviewed [REDACTED], who is one of [REDACTED]' sons. He was not present during the incident; however, stated his brother [REDACTED] had attempted to buy some "weed," on 5 January 2020, from Chance's girlfriend, Atianna. [REDACTED] talked to Atianna through text messages. [REDACTED] told Atianna he wanted to see the weed and Atianna told Sean, "pussy ass, you know what it looks like, you always hit me asking what it looks like." [REDACTED] responded to Atianna that she needed "to go get your pussy checked." Atianna told Chance what Sean had said to her and made Chance upset. [REDACTED] stated that Chance and Atianna lived together and they drove either a silver

colored Lexus or a white colored Equinox. [REDACTED] described Chance as a skinny black male, with "dreads." [REDACTED] stated he always rides passenger and keeps a gun under his seat and one in his pocket. Later, [REDACTED] positively identified Chance as Chance Boles from his Missouri Department of Revenue photograph taken for his issued driver license.

An interview was then conducted with [REDACTED], [REDACTED] eldest son. He stated he contacted Atianna Chavez, through Snapchat, yesterday on 5 January 2020 to buy some "weed." He knew Atianna because they attended high school together. They got into an argument about him wanting a picture of the "weed." [REDACTED] then contacted Chance, to buy some "weed" and sent a message to him stating, "cuz yo girl is trippin." Chance sent him an image of "4 nuggs" and [REDACTED] told Chance he was "good." Chance responded to [REDACTED] that he was going to "pull up" since he did not like the way he was talking to his girlfriend. On 6 January 2020 Chance texted him; however, he could not remember what he said. [REDACTED] thought he ended the text conversation without any problems; however, at 9:34 AM, he received a Snapchat message from Chance, which showed the barrel of a gun, pointing at the front of [REDACTED]'s residence. [REDACTED] later received a Snapchat message from Chance with stated, "go check yo house." K. Matlock provided screenshots of the Snapchat messages he received from Chance's account.

On Monday, 6 January 2020 Detective J. Treacy issued a Person of Interest for the suspect, Chance Boles, and the suspect vehicle, 2005 Lexus 330.

On Tuesday, 7 January 2020 the Lee's Summit Police Department requested assistance from various agencies to help look for the suspect, including the Grandview Police Department. Two Detective with the Grandview Police Department were staged near the suspect's residence at 12813 Bristol Avenue. They observed the suspect, C. Boles, driving the suspect vehicle, 2005 Lexus 330 with license plate ZE4 V4U, up to the residence located at 12813 Bristol Avenue. C. Boles parked the vehicle inside the garage which was attached to the residence. Later on, the Grandview Detectives watched C. Boles exit the residence and leave in another vehicle.

A search warrant was served at the residence and the following items were located:

- One box of Tulammo .380 ammunition, containing 8 rounds
- Box of .380 ammunition, containing 9 various rounds of .380 ammunition
- One spent .380 shell casing
- Two light gray hoodies

During the search warrant service, Atianna Chavez was detained. Detectives requested she respond to Police Headquarters to provide a statement.

Detective Reese conducted an interview with Atianna. During the interview, she confessed to shooting approximately 5 rounds into the residence. She also stated that Chance shot approximately 15 rounds into the residence. Atianna explained the firearms used in the shooting were placed into the trunk of the Pontiac at Dre Shelby's residence.

An interview with Chance was conducted. He denied any knowledge of the shooting incident, however stated his Snapchat handle is "chancethegod1."

Detectives later located [REDACTED] residence through Missouri DOR and photographed the residence and Pontiac sitting near the residence. The photograph was later provided to Atianna, who positively identified the Pontiac as the vehicle she placed the firearms into.

Detectives conducted surveillance on Andre Shelby's residence and noticed one black male inside the vehicle. The black male took a bag out of the vehicle and eventually entered a Nissan parked in the street. A car stop was conducted on the Nissan and consent was later granted to search the vehicle. A purple Nike bag containing a Chiappa .22 caliber handgun and a 9mm Beretta were recovered. Also recovered was a red Chiefs backpack, containing a .380 caliber Bersa Firestorm with drum magazine.
