**WARRANT REQUESTED**

**Count I. Murder 2nd Degree (565.021-001Y20200999.0)**

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the **class A felony of murder in the second degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about April 13, 2021, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly or with the purpose of causing serious physical injury to Michelle L Long caused the death of Michelle L Long by inflicting blunt force injury.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

**Murder**

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 04-15-2021, at approximately 0954 hours, Kansas City Missouri Police Officers were dispatched to 10611 E 98th Terrace (View High Lake Apartment Office), Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to a check the welfare call. Upon arrival Officers contacted the office staff who confirmed the person they were checking on, Michelle Long, lived at 10700 E 98th Terrace #2B. The officers and office staff responded to Long's apartment and the office staff stated they would do a walk-through of the apartment to check for water leaks. The office staff went inside Long's apartment and hurried out a short time later reporting there was an unresponsive naked female in one of the bedrooms, lying on the floor. Officers then went inside the apartment and found Long laying on her back with blood on her face and on the carpet near her. Long was pronounced deceased at the scene.

While processing the scene, Long was observed to have multiple large contusions on her body and head which made her mostly unrecognizable. It appeared as if someone shaved Long's hair off her head as there were clippers on the ground next to her and large clumps of her hair near her body and in different parts of the apartment. Apparent blood was observed on walls inside the bedroom and closet. An apparent bloody print was observed in the closet where Long's body was located. The bloody print was photographed and recovered for analysis.

A male named "[REDACTED]" later identified as [REDACTED] called 911 and asked Police to go check the welfare of Michelle Long because there were allegations she had been murdered. The 911 call taker asked [REDACTED] who was making these allegations and [REDACTED] responded his brother was. The 911 call taker asked [REDACTED] if his brother was saying he murdered her to which [REDACTED] stated, "Yep". [REDACTED] knew the apartment complex where the victim lived but did not know the exact address. Detectives later talked to [REDACTED] who confirmed he called 911 and stated his brother **Anthony Jones Jr** called him and told him, "It's all bad bro, I'm gonna spend the rest of my life in jail." [REDACTED] stated **Jones** told him, "it happened a couple of days ago." [REDACTED] stated his brother uses crack cocaine and, "beats

on his women" so he knew what he meant. [REDACTED] was shown a single picture of **Anthony D. Jones B/M 09/16/1985** and he identified him as his brother.

During an area canvas of the apartment [REDACTED] a neighbor stated on Tuesday night (4/13/21) they heard "loud noises like things were being thrown around the apartment." The neighbor further stated there is often loud music coming from that apartment as well and thought they remembered loud music on Monday (4/12/21) and Wednesday (4/13/21) night.

The investigation revealed Long's car, a green 1998 Toyota Camry with KS License plate 102NTA was missing from the apartment complex. Surveillance video showed the vehicle left the apartment on 04/14/2021 at 08:00:57 and did not return. A license plate reader captures the victim's vehicle entering KS at 670 (Bartle Hall) on 04-14-2021 @ 0930 hours.

Department of Revenue Records showed the 1998 Toyota Camry VIN: 4T1BG22K6WU216964 with KS Plate 102NTA was owned by Michelle Long.

**Jones** showed an address of 3308 Coronado in Kansas City, KS. Undercover detectives responded to the area of 3308 Coronado and located the listed vehicle behind 1216 Hilltop Road, Kansas City, KS which is in the same apartment complex and a short walk to 3308 Coronado. **Jones** was later observed leaving 3308 Coronado on 04/15/2021 by undercover detectives.

On 4/15/21 at approximately 2259 hours, **Jones** called 911 and stated he was at 3<sup>rd</sup> and Holmes, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri by Caddyshack and he wanted to turn himself in. When asked why, **Jones** stated, "Murder." On 4/15/21 at 2301 hours, Officers were dispatched to 3<sup>rd</sup> and Holmes where they contacted **Jones** and he was placed under arrest.

On 4/16/21, **Jones** was escorted to the 7<sup>th</sup> floor, interview room where he was read his Miranda Rights. **Jones** stated he did not know why detectives wanted to talk to him and only knew that his family told him police were looking for him. **Jones** admitted to knowing Long, but stated she was an ex-girlfriend he broke up with approximately 6 to 7 months ago. **Jones** was asked about a documented Domestic Violence assault that occurred on 2/8/21 that listed him as the suspect and Long as the victim (21-008891 and 21-008890), **Jones** denied being involved. A Facebook picture was presented to **Jones** which captured a photograph of him and Long together and posted on March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2021. In the heading, Long had written, "I love you" and in the comments section **Jones'** handle responded, "I love you too babe Michelle Long." When presented with this post, **Jones** started laughing. **Jones** denied driving the victim's vehicle and could not explain how her vehicle ended up parked near his mother's residence in Kansas City, Kansas. When being asked questions about his alibi, **Jones** invoked his rights and the interview ended.

**Jones** was processed for perishable evidence and his boxers were recovered. Apparent blood on his boxers reacted positively for the presence of blood.
