COMPLAINT WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Murder 2nd Degree (565.021-001Y20200999.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the **class A felony of murder in the second degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 21, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly caused the death of him.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the **felony of armed criminal action**, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about August 21, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of

State vs. Jayvon D. Rabb

Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Murder in the Second Degree charged in Count 1, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Murder in the Second Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a **deadly weapon**.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.3, RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

Date: 8-22-2022 Report: #2022-57450

I, Steven D. Schmidli, a Detective with the Independence, Missouri Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true.

- 1. I have probable cause to believe that on 8-21-2022 at about 1930 hrs., Jayvon D. Rabb (Race – B, Sex - M, DOB: 8-21-99, , Last Known Address: 1406 S. Harris, Independence MO 64052) Committed one or more criminal offenses in Jackson County, Missouri.
- 2. The facts supporting this believe are as follows:

That on 8-21-2022 at about 1930 hrs., the Defendant, Jayvon D. Rabb knowingly shot and killed Deionate J. Hair (dob: 5-3-2001) near the intersection of 14th Street and Scott which is located in the Hudson Apartment Complex. This offense occurred in Independence, Jackson County MO.

On 8-21-2022 at approximately 1930 hrs., Independence MO Police were dispatched to 11415 E. 14th St. in reference to shots fired in the area. Shortly after officers arrived on scene, two black male subjects were found deceased from apparent gun shot wounds. One of the male victims was located was lying in the street near the intersection of 14th and Scott while the other victim was located inside of a wrecked black sedan near the intersection of 14th and Cunningham. Responding officers located three separate crime scenes along 14th Street between Leoti and Cunningham where numerous spent shell casings were observed on the ground.

Sgt. Terry Dorman was the first officer to arrive on scene. He was immediately directed by witnesses to the address of 11323 E. 14th St. As Sgt. Dorman drove towards the address, he observed a black Chevrolet Cruze parked directly in front of the residence. He observed the vehicle to have four subjects milling around the vehicle. He approached the vehicle and immediately gave verbal commands to three black male subjects and one black female subject. Sgt. Dorman stated two of the male appeared to be getting ready to enter 11323 E. 14th St, and the third male was walking in front of 11321 E. 14th St. where he attempted to hide a handgun underneath a BBQ grill in front of the residence. All three males were detained as part of the patrol investigation along with the black female. Sgt. Dorman observed at least two hanguns inside the black Chevrolet Cruze in plain view in the back seat of the car. Several shell casings were located in the intersection of 14th and Leoti which is close proximity to the above mentioned residence. The three black male subjects were identified as Jayvon Rabb, The black female was identified as and Mr. Rabb was wearing a white tank top and stone washed jeans with holes in

them. The crime scene at 11323 E. 14th St. was surrounded by officers and formal police

announcements were made for any additional subjects to exit the duplex. Two black male subjects exited the residence and were detained as part of the patrol investigation. The two black male subjects were identified as


The secondary crime scene was located directly east from Leoti and at the intersection of 14th and Scott which is inside the Hudson Apartment Complex. A deceased black male subject was found on the ground near a black Ford Edge SUV which had reported as stolen. The deceased black male had been shot several times. Numerous shell casings littered the intersection near the black SUV. This crime scene was secured and protected by responding officers.

The third crime scene was located directly east from Scott and near the intersection of 14th and Cunningham which is inside the Hudson Apartment Complex. Responding officers observed multiple cars that had been parked along and on the south side of 14th Street just west of Cunningham to have been completely destroyed by a black Chevrolet Malibu which was also extremely damaged from the violent collision. Inside the Chevrolet Malibu was a deceased black male subject whom also appeared to have been shot. Bullet holes were observed on the drivers side of this vehicle. A handgun was also observed in this vehicle. This crime scene was secured and protected by responding officers. IPD Detectives and Crime Scene personnel arrived on scene and began processing the crime scene for evidence. The five black male subjects and the one black female subject were transported to IPD Headquarters for formal statements on the incident. The Jackson County Medical Examiner's Office responded and recovered the bodies of the two victims. The Chevrolet Cruze, the Ford Edge and the Chervolet Malibu were secured and towed to the IPD Canine Unit for evidence purposes.

Det. Steve Schmidli and Det. Steve Breshears attempted to interview Mr. Jayvon Rabb about the shooting. After being advised of his rights, he denied any involvement in the incident. Mr. Rabb was escorted to detention and placed on an investigative hold regarding this homicide investigation.

On 8-22-2022, Det. Schmidli responded to the body examinations of the two black male victims at the Jackson County Medical Examiner's Office. The shooting victim from 14th and Scott was identified as Deionate J. Hair (dob: 5-3-2001) and had four gunshot wounds to the left side of his upper body. The victim from the wrecked Chevrolet Malibu had been shot twice, once in the left side of head and once in the upper back. This victim was determined to be a juvenile and identified as (dob: 9-16-2005).

On 8-22-2022, Det. Jeff Pagel, Det. John Roach Det. McKee and Det. Emily Knox conducted a neighborhood canvas around 14th and Scott and contacted three separate witnesses to the shooting incident at that intersection. Det. Pagel spoke with a who resides at advised that on 8-21-2022, he was inside his residence and heard shots being fired outside. He stated that when he looked out his window and observed three black males standing on the west side of the intersection of 14th and Scott. Mr. Woodson advised one of the males had dreads, a white tank top, stone washed jeans with holes in them and was carrying a silver handgun. Mr. Woodson described the other
