Pursuant to 556.061 RSMo, the class A felony of robbery in the first degree is classified as a dangerous felony requiring the defendant to serve 85% of any sentence imposed prior to being eligible for release. The class A felony carries a punishment range of from 10 up to 30 years, or life, in the Missouri Department of Corrections.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205212.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about July 5, 2024, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of robbery in the first degree charged

in Count I, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of robbery in the first degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.3, RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years.

Count III. Robbery - 1st Degree (570.023-001Y20201201.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 570.023, RSMo, committed the class A felony of robbery in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about July 5, 2024, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant forcibly stole U.S. currency in the possession of [REDACTED], and in the course thereof the defendant displayed or threatened the use of what appeared to be a deadly weapon.

Pursuant to 556.061 RSMo, the class A felony of robbery in the first degree is classified as a dangerous felony requiring the defendant to serve 85% of any sentence imposed prior to being eligible for release. The class A felony carries a punishment range of from 10 up to 30 years, or life, in the Missouri Department of Corrections.

Count IV. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205212.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about July 5, 2024, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of robbery in the first degree charged in Count III, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of robbery in the first degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. Pursuant to 556.061 RSMo, the class A felony of robbery in the first degree is classified as a dangerous felony requiring the defendant to serve 85% of any sentence

imposed prior to being eligible for release. The class A felony carries a punishment range of from 10 up to 30 years, or life, in the Missouri Department of Corrections.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

 (Description of Identity)

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

Detectives with the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department Robbery Unit have been investigating a series of pattern robberies since 12/20/2023. A suspect vehicle was developed through business surveillance cameras, doorbell cameras of nearby residences, and covert surveillance cameras from multiple robberies. The suspect vehicle was a [Redacted]. The vehicle is registered to [Redacted], CALDWELL's [Redacted]. On 01/27/2024, the vehicle was stopped by officers in connection with the robberies. The driver identified himself as Manyiuel CALDWELL B/M [Redacted]. Two handguns were located in plain view by the officers on scene and recovered. A search warrant was obtained for the Buick on 01/29/2024. Clothing matching the photographs from three previous robberies were found inside the vehicle. CALDWELL was arrested for Unlawful Use of a Weapon and transported to [Redacted]. He was not charged for that incident and released from custody. Detectives have continued to monitor CALDWELL's residences and vehicles driven by him due to the continuation of the robberies since he was released from custody.

On 07/05/2024 at 0103 hours, officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [Redacted], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to an armed business robbery. Upon arrival, officers contacted the victim (store clerk) and determined two black male suspects committed an armed business robbery. Detectives reviewed camera footage and observed two black males walk east on [Redacted] before entering the store. Suspect #1 (Manyiuel Caldwell B/M 02/03/2006) was wearing a dark blue hoodie, white face covering, black pants with three vertical white stripes on each leg, white shoes and blue rubber gloves and was armed with a black handgun. Suspect #2 stayed at the front door, holding it open. Suspect #2 was wearing a black hooded coat, black face covering, white shirt, camo style pants, and black shoes with yellow and orange on the soles and he was armed with a black rifle. Suspect #1 walked behind the counter and pointed the gun at the clerk. The clerk opened both cash registers and Suspect #1 took the cash. Both suspects exited the store and ran west on [Redacted].

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On 07/05/2024 at 0131 hours, officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to an armed business robbery. Upon arrival, officers contacted the victim (store clerk) and determined two black male suspects committed an armed business robbery. Detectives reviewed camera footage from the convenience store and the laundry mat/carwash next door and observed the following: on 07/05/2024 at 0108 hours, a dark blue four door sedan (which appeared to be a Kia) parked in the back parking lot of the laundry mat/carwash [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri). Suspect #1 (Manyiuel Caldwell B/M [REDACTED]) exited the back-passenger side of the vehicle wearing a dark blue hoodie, a white face covering, black pants with three vertical white stripes on each leg, white shoes, and blue rubber gloves. Suspect #2 exited the back-driver's side of the vehicle wearing a black jacket, a black face covering, a white shirt, camo style pants, and black shoes with yellow and orange on the soles. Both suspects walked into the convenience store. Suspect #2, armed with a black handgun, stays at the front door and holds it open. Suspect #1, armed with an AK style rifle with wood on the barrel, pointed the gun at the clerk. The clerk raised his hands and ran into the back room. Suspect #1 walked behind the counter, pushed open the back-room door and forced the clerk to open the cash registers at gunpoint. Both suspects run back to the dark blue sedan and entered the back seat. The sedan left the area east on [REDACTED].

On 07/05/2024, officers of the Independence Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED] Independence, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to an armed business robbery that occurred at 2318 hours. The suspect was a black male wearing a black hoodie with "Good Vibes Only" in yellow writing on the front, a white and black face covering, black pants, and white shoes, armed with an AK style rifle. He arrived and left the location in a dark blue four door sedan.

On 07/05/2024 at 2355 hours, officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to an armed business robbery. Upon arrival, officers contacted the victim (store clerk) and determined an armed business robbery occurred. Detectives reviewed camera footage and observed the following: a black male suspect (Manyiuel Caldwell B/M [REDACTED]) entered the business wearing a black hoodie with "Good Vibes Only" in yellow writing on the front, a white face covering, black pants, and white shoes, and was armed with an AK style rifle with wood on the barrel. He went behind the counter and pointed the gun at the clerk. The clerk opened the cash register and the suspect removed the cash before exiting the store.

On 07/06/2024 at 0100 hours, officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to a panic alarm. Officers contacted the store clerk who advised the following: He was aware of multiple other [REDACTED] being robbed recently. On 07/05/2024 at 2347 hours, he observed a black male wearing a hoodie and locked his front door, believing he was going to be robbed. Officers and detectives reviewed the camera footage which showed a dark blue four door sedan pull into the parking lot at [REDACTED]. A black male wearing a black hoodie with "Good Vibes Only" in yellow writing on the front, a black and white face covering, black pants, and white shoes, armed with an AK style rifle, exited the back-passenger seat of the dark blue sedan.

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He walked up to the front door and attempted to open it. When he realized the door was locked, he re-entered the back-passenger side of the dark blue sedan which then left east on [REDACTED]

On 07/07/2024 at 1826 hours, officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to an armed business robbery. Upon arrival, officers contacted the victim (store clerk) and determined an armed business robbery occurred. Detectives reviewed camera footage which showed the following: On 07/07/2024 at approximately 1820 hours, a dark blue four door sedan drove west on [REDACTED]. At 1822 hours, two black male suspects walked into the business. Suspect #1 (Manyiuel Caldwell B/M [REDACTED]) was wearing a blue hooded jacket, a black face covering, a white tank top, blue rubber gloves, black shorts with white drawstrings and a white Nike emblem on the left leg, white ankle socks, and black shoes and was armed with an AK style rifle with wood on the barrel. Suspect #2 was wearing a gray hooded jacket, black face covering, light blue jeans, blue rubber gloves, and white and gray shoes, and was armed with a black handgun with an extended magazine. Suspect #2 stayed at the door, keeping it open. Suspect #1 walked to the checkout counter and pointed the gun at the clerk. The clerk opened the cash register and Suspect #1 removed the cash. Both suspects then ran west through the parking lot.

On 07/07/2024 at 1849 hours, officers with the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to an armed robbery. Upon arrival, officers contacted the victim (store clerk) and determined an armed business robbery occurred. Detectives reviewed the camera footage which showed the following: On 07/07/2024 at 1840 hours, two black male suspects walk east through the parking lot and enter the front doors of the business. Suspect #1 (Manyiuel Caldwell B/M [REDACTED]) was wearing a blue hooded jacket, a black face covering, a white tank top, blue rubber gloves, black shorts with white drawstrings and a white Nike emblem on the left leg, white ankle socks, and black shoes and was armed with an AK style rifle with wood on the barrel. Suspect #2 was wearing a gray hooded jacket, black face covering, light blue jeans, blue rubber gloves, and white and gray shoes, and was armed with a black handgun with an extended magazine. Suspect #2 stayed at the door, keeping it open. Suspect #1 walked to the checkout counter and pointed the gun at the clerk. The clerk opened the cash register and Suspect #1 removed the cash. Both suspects then ran west through the parking lot.

On 07/07/2024 at 1921 hours, officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to a hold up alarm. Upon arrival, officers contacted the victim (store clerk) and determined an armed business robbery occurred. Detectives reviewed the camera footage from [REDACTED] and a neighboring business [REDACTED] which showed the following: On 07/07/2024 at approximately 1848 hours, a black male suspect (Manyiuel Caldwell B/M [REDACTED]) wearing a blue hooded jacket, a black face covering, a white tank top, black shorts with white drawstrings and a white Nike emblem on the left leg, white ankle socks, and black shoes walked north on [REDACTED] before entering [REDACTED]. He grabbed an item from the store and placed it on the counter. He handed the clerk what appeared to be U.S. Currency and when she opened the cash register, Suspect #1 pulled out a black handgun with an extended magazine from under his left armpit. He pointed the gun at the clerk and removed the cash from the register. Suspect #1 ran south on [REDACTED] and entered into the passenger side of a dark blue four door sedan.

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Manyiuel Caldwell had a reported address at [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri which is in the [REDACTED]. On 07/07/2024, the case detective was reviewing camera footage from [REDACTED] due to the multiple robberies between 07/05/2024 and 07/07/2024 (listed above) where it appears the same vehicle was used. On 07/04/2024 at 2355 hours, a dark four door sedan is seen parked in front of [REDACTED]. The sedan is clearly missing the driver's door handle which is common with stolen Kias. On 07/05/2024 at 0011 hours, a black male with short dreads wearing a dark hoodie, black Nike backpack with white lettering, black pants with three vertical white stripes on each leg, and white shoes walks from the direction [REDACTED] toward the roundabout. Based on prior in person contact, the case detective was able to identify this person as Manyiuel Caldwell B/M [REDACTED]. He stayed at the roundabout for a few minutes then walked back toward the apartment. The dark four door sedan left the apartment complex around 0015 hours. Approximately two hours later (after the robberies) at 0159 hours, a black male wearing a gray jacket, black pants with three vertical white stripes on each leg and white shoes was seen walking across the parking lot near [REDACTED]. The black pants with vertical white strips and the white shoes appeared to be the same clothing worn by Suspect #1 during the two robberies on the morning of 07/05/2024 (listed above). On 07/07/2024 at 1946 hours (approximately one hour after the three robberies on 07/07/2024 described above), the case detective observed a black [REDACTED] Manyiuel Caldwell was known to drive, return to [REDACTED]. Manyiuel Caldwell exited the driver's seat and was observed wearing a black t-shirt, black shorts with white drawstrings and a white Nike emblem on the left leg, white ankle socks, and black shoes. The shorts, socks, and shoes appeared to be the same clothing worn by Suspect #1 during the robberies on 07/07/2024. He was also carrying a black Nike bag with white lettering that appeared to be the same bag he had on 07/05/2024 at the roundabout.

Utilizing Genetec City Cameras, Kansas City officers were able to track the dark blue four door sedan to an intersection equipped with an Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR). The license plate on the dark blue four door sedan was a [REDACTED]. That license plate responded back to a [REDACTED] [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. On 07/11/2024, officers received a tip about a [REDACTED] Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri that was possibly stolen. Officers located a [REDACTED] and the license plates had been removed. They completed a check of the VIN and it responded back as stolen. Officers towed the vehicle to the city tow lot with a hold for the Robbery Unit. Detectives obtained consent and processed the vehicle. The driver's door handle was missing which is common with stolen Kias. There was a blue [REDACTED] bank bag in the back seat with [REDACTED] written on it. There were two blue rubber gloves on the backseat, one blue rubber glove on the back floorboard behind the driver's seat, two blue rubber gloves on the front passenger seat, and one blue rubber glove between the seat on the door frame on the front passenger side. The items were recovered and sent to the Kansas City Crime Laboratory for processing. Based on review from surveillance video from the robberies and surveillance from [REDACTED], the stolen Kia was similar in appearance to the vehicle used in the robberies.

On 08/07/2024, the Kansas City Crime Laboratory notified detectives of the results from the examination of the blue rubber gloves found in the [REDACTED]. The blue glove found on the back-passenger

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floor was swabbed for DNA and the swab had four DNA contributors. Manyiuel Caldwell's DNA was compared to the DNA from that swab. There was very strong support for Manyiuel Caldwell to be a contributor to the DNA found on the glove. It was noted that the genetic information from the swab was greater than 1 billion times more likely to be observed if Manyiuel Caldwell and three unknown individuals are the contributors than if four unknown individuals are the contributors.

On 07/17/2024, Manyiuel Caldwell B/M [REDACTED] was apprehended and charged for an armed business robbery. During his interview with detectives, he signed a consent form for his buccal swab to be collected. The buccal swab was recovered and sent to the Kansas City Crime Laboratory for processing. He also signed a consent form for his phone data to be downloaded. His phone was taken to the Heart of America Regional Computer Forensics Laboratory (HARCFL) for examination. Detectives applied for and were granted search warrants for the residences and vehicles associated with Manyiuel Caldwell. Detectives located the "Good Vibes Only" hoodie and an AK style rifle with wood on the barrel from the residence where Manyiuel Caldwell was arrested. Detectives located the black pants with three vertical white stripes, white shoes, black shorts with white drawstrings and a white Nike emblem on the left leg from Manyiuel Caldwell's personal vehicle. Manyiuel Caldwell admitted his DNA would be on the AK style rifle detectives located. He also admitted to committing a robbery on [REDACTED] Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

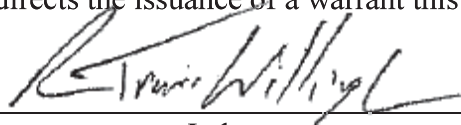
On 09/12/2024, the case detective reviewed the examination report from HARCFL. The examiner observed and tagged a photo taken on Manyiuel Caldwell's phone. The photo was taken on the evening of 07/05/2024 at 2203 hours (approximately one hour before the Independence robbery) and appears to be a "selfie". In the photo, Manyiuel Caldwell is wearing a black hoodie with the "Good Vibes Only" in yellow writing and pink mushrooms on the front. He is holding an AK style rifle with wood on the barrel that has a drum magazine attached. The hoodie and the gun appear to be the same items used in the three robberies on the night of 07/05/2024.

Forensic analysis has also linked Manyiuel Caldwell as a suspect to a residential robbery from [REDACTED] and he is believed to be the suspect in approximately 35 armed business robberies since December 2023.
