The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 02-12-2025, at approximately 0844 hours, officers with the Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri on a reported armed robbery (documented under Kansas City Police Case Report Number 25008701).

Upon arrival, officers contacted victim employee [REDACTED] who stated he had pulled a 2018 white or silver Nissan Rogue, identified bearing Missouri license plate [REDACTED] (VIC VEH) out of the shop. [REDACTED] stated he observed a white male, approximately 5'5" to 5'8", with a long beard, wearing black pants and holding a "bunch" of hoodies, later identified as **KEITH, JASON W/M 07-12-1985**. [REDACTED] stated he observed **KEITH** walk past him as [REDACTED] was exiting the Nissan Rogue. [REDACTED] began to walk away and heard **KEITH** say something to him. [REDACTED] turned around and **KEITH** stated to him "I don't want to kill you man, just give me the key fob." [REDACTED] advised he took a step toward **KEITH** and **KEITH** raised the bundle of hoodies he was holding. [REDACTED] observed a rifle sticking out of one of the sleeves of clothing. **KEITH** stated again, "give me the fucking key, I don't want to kill you." [REDACTED] said **KEITH** then tapped the barrel of the rifle onto his chest, took the key fob and left the scene in the Nissan Rogue.

State Line Nissan employee [REDACTED] stated she witnessed **KEITH** walking through the parking lot of State Line Nissan and observed him to have a scruffy beard, dirty green jacket, black pants, black shoes and a jacket wrapped in his hand. [REDACTED] stated she turned and told a manager that **KEITH** was not giving her a good feeling. When she turned back around she observed [REDACTED] with his hands up and the suspect leave the area in the Nissan Rogue.

State Line Nissan employee [REDACTED] stated he witnessed **KEITH** with a green hoodie, black pants, scruffy beard, carrying a bag walking through the parking lot of the State Line Nissan. [REDACTED] observed

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KEITH walking near vehicles and thought he might pull on door handles. [REDACTED] stated he turned to his manager and thought **KEITH** looked suspicious. [REDACTED] then observed **KEITH** do something with his hands and then [REDACTED] observed [REDACTED] give the suspect the keys to the car. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] looked like he had seen a ghost and then realized [REDACTED] was robbed.

When detectives received the call from officers in regard to the robbery and were advised the suspect was a white male with a beard, possibly homeless, who concealed a rifle; detectives immediately recognized a similar modus operandi used by identified robbery suspect **KEITH**. (See below two robberies that occurred on 01-31-2025 and 02-05-2025)

On 01-31-2025, at approximately 2301 hours, officers with the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri on a reported armed business robbery (documented under Kansas City Police Case Report Number 25006231).

Employee victim [REDACTED] a white male wearing a black coat and black pants, later identified as **KEITH** entered the store and began shopping. **KEITH** then approached the counter as [REDACTED] was scanning items and produced a rifle that appeared to be wrapped in a cloth. [REDACTED] stated he backed away from the counter and **KEITH** followed him, pointed the rifle at him and again told [REDACTED] to "put stuff in the bag." **KEITH** then fired one shot at [REDACTED] and missed. [REDACTED] then ran out of the building.

Footage from the business showed the following: **KEITH** had a beard and a camo type hoodie under a black Carhartt jacket with a distinct logo on the left breast and Carhartt logo on lower left pocket, black jeans with a set of keys on a carabiner on a belt loop on his left hip. **KEITH** wore black shoes and has a black baseball type long bag slung around his shoulder with a tan strap. Inside the bag appeared to be a rifle with a tan grip. Footage corroborated [REDACTED] statement. As [REDACTED] exited the register area, **KEITH** pointed the rifle at [REDACTED], who had attempted to take cover behind an aisle shelf. **KEITH** fired one round into the ceiling area above [REDACTED]

Footage showed **KEITH** took money from the register, a black Raider's hat, two apparent bottles of rubbing alcohol and an apparent "peach" alcohol and exited the store on foot.

[REDACTED] was unable to identify **KEITH** in a photo lineup.

Detectives disseminated pictures of **KEITH** to other Law Enforcement agencies and received an overwhelming response stating the suspect matched the description of **KEITH**. In one of the responses, a Be On The Lookout (BOLO) was also attached from a theft of a rifle that occurred in Kansas City, Kansas at a [REDACTED] on 01-10-2025 (KCK CRN 2025-0002257) where **KEITH** was identified as the suspect of the theft. The rifle stolen was a tan FNM2495 556 rifle [REDACTED] Pictures of **KEITH** on the BOLO show a white male with a beard and slightly shorter mustache hair. **KEITH** was also observed wearing a green jacket with 4 distinct front pockets on the jacket.

On 02-05-2025 Independence, Missouri Police Department reported an armed business robbery at a [REDACTED], Independence, Jackson County, Missouri (IPD CRN 2025-00007053)

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where a white male suspect (**KEITH**), showed the victim employee he had a rifle in a bag, demanded money and took money and items and left the area.

Detectives reviewed surveillance footage from the Independence PD case. **KEITH** was wearing a light camo baseball hat with brown Bass Pro Shop logo on the front of the hat and an American flag stitched on the left side of the hat, but otherwise his face is not covered. **KEITH** appeared to be wearing the same green jacket with four (4) distinct front pockets as observed in the Kansas City, Kansas BOLO. **KEITH** had the same distinct beard with shorter mustache hair as observed in the Kansas City, Kansas BOLO. **KEITH** appeared to have the same camouflage hoodie as observed in the [REDACTED] armed robbery on 01-31-2025. **KEITH** appeared to be wearing the same black jeans and black shoes as the [REDACTED] armed robbery on 01-31-2025. **KEITH** appeared to have the same set of keys on a carabiner on his left hip as the [REDACTED] armed robbery on 01-31-2025 and **KEITH** had a concealed rifle with a tan grip in a long bag.

Due to **KEITH** being known to detectives as a suspect in the aforementioned two robberies, to be a white male, to have the appearance of being homeless and to use a rifle concealed in clothing during robberies, he was considered a Subject of Interest and his photograph was utilized in a photo lineup.

On 02-12-2025 [REDACTED] responded to Police Headquarters in regard to CRN 25008701.

[REDACTED] viewed a photo lineup with **KEITH** and 5 other subjects of similar appearance and stated **KEITH** was the suspect. [REDACTED] was 7 out of 10 certain.

[REDACTED] viewed a photo lineup with **KEITH** and 5 other subjects of similar appearance and stated **KEITH** was the suspect. [REDACTED] was "pretty certain."

[REDACTED] viewed a photo lineup with **KEITH** and 5 other subjects of similar appearance and did not identify a suspect.

On 02-12-2025, at approximately 0924 hours, Officers were conducting an area canvass for the stolen silver Nissan Rogue when they observed the vehicle at [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri at a gas station. An unknown black male was observed walking away from the passenger side of the vehicle. [REDACTED] and other officers attempted a felony car check in the gas station parking lot and the Nissan Rogue fled and eluded officers in marked patrol vehicles driving with lights and sirens. The vehicle continued to elude for approximately 2.6 miles driving into oncoming traffic with snowy conditions. Officers were advised to discontinue the pursuit due to weather. Officers advised the driver of the vehicle appeared to be **KEITH**.

At approximately 1600 hours, an officer working in an off-duty capacity observed the silver Nissan Rogue park on the street facing northbound just to the north of [REDACTED]. The officer advised during his regular work shifts for the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department he is assigned to the Real Time Crime Center Unit, and had knowledge of the robbery/carjacking. The officer was able to identify the silver Nissan Rogue as the carjacked vehicle and **KEITH** as the driver as **KEITH** got out of the driver seat

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wearing a dark in color hooded sweatshirt with the hood up. The officer said **KEITH** was also carrying something long and skinny with blankets or cloth covering it. The officer observed **KEITH** walk northbound on [REDACTED] from the vehicle and then eastbound on [REDACTED]. The officer was able to watch **KEITH** turn Northbound on [REDACTED] and continue to walk northbound towards [REDACTED]. The officer was able to direct additional responding officers to **KEITH**'s location where they attempted to contact him. As officers approached **KEITH**, he brandished a rifle, pointed it at the officers and fired two rounds in the direction of the Officers.

Officer victim [REDACTED] and Officer victim [REDACTED] arrived to the area just south of [REDACTED] in marked patrol vehicle #842 in full uniform on duty along with Sergeant victim [REDACTED] in marked patrol vehicle #109 in full uniform on duty along with Officer victim [REDACTED] in marked patrol vehicle #466 in full uniform on duty.

[REDACTED] was dropped off by Officer [REDACTED] in full uniform on duty. [REDACTED] was dropped off to assist the above listed Officer's while [REDACTED] parked their patrol vehicle in the area of [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri to establish a perimeter.

[REDACTED] stated he and [REDACTED] received the information disseminated by the off-duty Officer and Real Time. [REDACTED] stated he responded to the area and observed **KEITH** walking northbound on the westside sidewalk just south of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said he gave verbal commands to **KEITH** to stop. [REDACTED] stated he observed **KEITH** grab and manipulate a bag he was carrying as **KEITH** walked to the south side [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. [REDACTED] stated he took cover, looked up and observed a rifle pointed in the direction of he and [REDACTED] patrol vehicle and where Officer [REDACTED] was positioned. [REDACTED] stated he took cover again and heard gunfire from two different caliber firearms. [REDACTED] stated after the gunfire **KEITH** ran westbound between 9th Street and 10th Street toward Elmwood Avenue.

[REDACTED] stated he was on a driveway of a residence with an elevated porch and ground that provided him cover when shots were fired.

[REDACTED] stated he was standing near the front driver's side of Officer [REDACTED] and Officer [REDACTED] patrol vehicle #842 when shots were fired.

Sergeant [REDACTED] stated when the original shots were fired by **KEITH**, he was either in the street or on the sidewalk just south of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he ran to the back of [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri and could see **KEITH** in the lot next to the [REDACTED] residence. [REDACTED] stated that's where he could see **KEITH** and that is where he fired from.

A review of officer's body worn cameras and the in-car video from patrol vehicle #842 showed **KEITH** walk westbound and to the south side of [REDACTED]. **KEITH** is observed posting up by the southside of the front porch area of [REDACTED] as Officer's approach. **KEITH** is observed pointing a firearm in the direction of Officers and patrol vehicle #842. **KEITH** is seen firing two shots from his firearm at Officers and patrol vehicle #842 before fleeing the area and running back to the silver Nissan Rogue.

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The Aggravated Assault on Law Enforcement was documented under Kansas City Police Case Report Number 25008783.

After **KEITH** fired shots at the Officer's, he fled westbound on foot and entered the driver's seat of the Nissan Rogue and a police pursuit was initiated by [REDACTED] and other officers with marked Patrol vehicles utilizing lights and sirens. **KEITH** traveled westbound on 12th Street to southbound on Brooklyn Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri driving into oncoming lanes of traffic causing significant risk of injury to the public. **KEITH** continued westbound onto Interstate 70 exceeding the posted speed limit and reaching speeds of 82 miles per hour while weaving across multiple lanes of traffic.

A Tactical Response Officer responded to the area and successfully completed a Tactical Vehicle Intervention (TVI) at Interstate 70 and Mulberry Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. **KEITH** initially ignored verbal commands to exit the vehicle and bean bag rounds were utilized. **KEITH** then exited the vehicle and was taken into custody. In total the pursuit lasted for approximately five (5) miles.

KEITH was the driver and sole occupant of the silver Nissan Rogue.

The tan FNM2495 556 rifle [REDACTED] stolen from the Cabela's in Kansas City, KS on 01-10-2025 (KCK CRN 2025-0002257) was observed on the front passenger area of the Nissan Rogue and recovered as evidence with one (1) live rifle round in the chamber, one (1) live rifle round loose between the magazine and chamber and 19 live rifle rounds in the magazine. All rounds were Hornady 223 REM rifle rounds. The live round loose between the magazine and chamber had a firing pin mark, but was still a live round.

Crime Scene Technicians responded to [REDACTED] Boulevard and the following was photographed and recovered as evidence: Four (4) 9mm shell casings on Van Brunt Boulevard in front of 914 Van Brunt Boulevard. One (1) 9mm shell casing in the drive way of 914 Van Brunt Boulevard. [REDACTED] & K-9 Shiloh responded. Koerner and K-9 Shiloh located three (3) more 9mm shell casings on Van Brunt Boulevard in front of [REDACTED] and two (2) more 9mm shell casings in the driveway of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] located three (3) .40 caliber shell casings near the northwest corner of [REDACTED].

Koerner & K-9 Shiloh located two (2) .223 shell casings at 914 Van Brunt Boulevard just south of the front porch with headstamp Hornady 223 REM.

Apparent defects were observed on the hood and front windshield of patrol vehicle #842 and in the direct area where Officer [REDACTED] had been standing when **KEITH** fired his firearm.

KEITH was transported to Metro Patrol Station on a 24 hour investigative hold.

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Detectives responded to Metro Patrol Station to recover **KEITH**'s clothes and items placed in his property search incident to arrest. Detectives observed **KEITH** wearing the same apparent camo type hoodie he wore during the armed business robbery on 01-31-2025 (KCPD CRN 25006231) and the armed business robbery in Independence (IPD CRN 2025-00007053). Detectives observed **KEITH** wearing the same apparent black Carhartt hoodie with logo on left breast and Carhartt logo on left lower pocket he wore during armed business robbery on 01-31-2025 (KCPD CRN 25006231). Detectives observed **KEITH** wearing the same apparent black jeans and black shoes he wore during the armed business robbery on 01-31-2025 (KCPD CRN 25006231) and the armed business robbery in Independence (IPD CRN 2025-00007053).

Detectives observed and recovered, in **KEITH**'s property, the same apparent light camo baseball hat with brown Bass Pro Shop logo on the front of the hat and an American flag stitched on the left side of the hat he wore during the armed business robbery in Independence (IPD CRN 2025-00007053). Detectives observed a set of keys on a carabiner that appear to be the same keys and carabiner **KEITH** wore during the armed business robbery on 01-31-2025 (KCPD CRN 25006231) and the armed business robbery in Independence (IPD CRN 2025-00007053).

Detectives observed and recovered in **KEITH**'s property 2 loose live Hornady 223 REM rifle rounds and two boxes containing 40 live Hornady 223 REM rifle rounds.

Detectives attempted to interview **KEITH** and he asked for a lawyer and refused to leave his jail cell.

A computer check of **KEITH** revealed a supervision date of 07-19-2019 supervised release after 36 months on charge for Unlawful Transport of Firearms (MO48017G US probation) from a Weapon's Offense with the ATF from 11-19-2015. On 02-27-2004 **KEITH** was found guilty of 2nd Degree Burglary and Receiving Stolen Property out of Lee's Summit, Missouri (Case #16CR0300298301) and received confinement of 7 years. On 12-16-2004 **KEITH** was found guilty on 2nd Degree Robbery Jackson County Circuit Court (Case #16CR0400248801) and received 7 years confinement. On 04-08-2004 **KEITH** was found guilty of 1st Degree Burglary (Case #16CR0400249101) and received 7 years confinement. On 05-17-2022 **KEITH** was found guilty of Stealing \$750 or more (Case #2116CR578101) out of Jackson County Circuit Court and received 2 years confinement.

KEITH has two active Felony warrants; Felony Theft out of Kansas Bureau of Investigation with a \$30,000 bond (warrant #25CR0033) and a Felony 2nd Degree Burglary warrant out of Jackson County (warrant #2416-CR03155-01).

KEITH is a convicted felon and prohibited from possessing a firearm and/or ammunition.

Due to the violent nature of this incident, **KEITH, JASON** should be considered a danger to the public.
