The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 04/17/2025 at approximately 1805 hours, officers of the Kansas City Missouri Police Department were dispatched to call regarding a hit and run at [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

The 911 caller had advised he had run over a man named [REDACTED] (deceased victim) while driving his black Chevy Equinox. The caller advised that the victim ([REDACTED]) had robbed him the day prior and that shortly before the caller ran over the victim, the victim had approached his black Chevy. The caller advised 911 that he was parked around the corner from the dispatched location.

Upon arrival, officers located the victim ([REDACTED]) in the middle of 51st Street, in between Swope Parkway and Cleveland Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. The victim was transported to Research Medical Center and pronounced deceased at 1935 hours.

KCPD received another call regarding this incident at 1915 hours, still on 04/17/2025, from the same caller as before. This time the caller identified himself as Anthony Milligan (later identified as Anthony Milligan, B/M, DOB: [REDACTED]). Milligan (defendant) again stated that he ran over the victim with his car and that he was the party that called 911 earlier. Defendant also again stated that the victim had robbed him the day prior (04/16/2025) and that he believed the victim was trying to rob him again. Defendant stated that the victim was pulling on his black Chevy's door handles, as if he were trying to open the door, and that he thought victim had a weapon at the time. Defendant stated that he attempted to reverse his vehicle and accidentally ran over the victim. Defendant advised he was calling from [REDACTED]

Officers responded [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri and took Defendant into custody. Defendant's black 2021 Chevy Equinox, bearing Missouri plate [REDACTED], was towed to the City Tow Lot, [REDACTED], Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

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Detectives then interviewed Defendant, after he was read the Miranda Warning and agreed to speak with detectives. He stated he had known the victim for years but had just recently reconnected with him. Defendant stated that he lives at the Senior Living Apartments located at [REDACTED] and that the victim lived at the apartments across the street, at [REDACTED]. Defendant further stated that several days prior, he had told the victim to leave him alone and to stop contacting him, advising he ultimately blocked the victim's phone number, but that the victim continued to contact him.

Defendant further stated that on 04/16/2025, he had arrived in the parking lot of his apartment complex ([REDACTED]) in his black Chevy Equinox when the victim pulled up in a truck behind him. Defendant then told victim to leave him alone and defendant then proceeded to the back of his vehicle to retrieve groceries. At that time, according to Defendant, the victim reached into Defendant's driver's door and grabbed Defendant's wallet and left with it. Defendant then called 911 and filed a police report (CRN: [REDACTED]).

Defendant stated that on 04/17/2025, he pulled into his apartment parking lot again and observed the victim walking across the street towards him. Defendant stated he locked his doors and rolled up his windows so the victim could not enter his vehicle. Defendant then slightly rolled down one of his car windows and told the victim, again, to leave him alone. Defendant stated that the victim was pulling on the door handles to his vehicle and was trying to open the doors. Defendant stated that at one point, the victim picked up a brick but threw it back down to the ground. Defendant told the victim, "[REDACTED] I'm gonna run your ass over." At that point, the victim was near the driver's side of Defendant's Chevy and Defendant stated he drove forward and ran over the victim. Defendant heard the thud and advised that the victim had gotten "caught up" in one of the wheels of his Chevy. Defendant advised he then drove down the street, looked in his rearview mirror and saw the victim laying in the street. At that point, Defendant called 911 and drove to the grocery store parking lot. He stated he heard police sirens but was never contacted so he drove to a friend's house off Wabash where he called police again.

Defendant was asked whether the victim had any weapons and he replied that he did not see any. When Defendant was asked whether he knew the victim to ever carry any weapons on him, Defendant stated that he never knew the victim to carry weapons. Finally, Defendant was asked if the victim ever threw the brick at him or threatened him with it, and he stated that the victim just picked the brick up and then threw it back down.

Defendant signed a Consent to Search for his DNA to be collected and a Consent to Search for his phone to be downloaded.

On 04/18/2025, Detectives responded back out to the crime scene ([REDACTED]) to obtain video of the offense. The surveillance video shows the victim walk across the street into the parking lot of [REDACTED] Avenue, while the black Chevy is in the parking lot. As soon as the victim walks to the front of the Chevy, Defendant is observed driving forward at the victim. As the victim then backs away into a median on the street, the Chevy drives off the street onto the median. The Chevy then reverses and the victim stays on the median. The Chevy then drives forward again towards the victim as he quickly tries to walk away to avoid the vehicle. The Chevy stops and then the victim walks towards the driver's door. The vehicle reverses again while the victim stays still. The victim then crosses over to another median as the Chevy drives at him again. The victim then walks in the grass towards the parking lot exit and the Chevy follows. The victim is observed

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picking up an object from the ground as he approaches to the exit/entrance to the parking lot, and then walks back into the grass. The black Chevy slowly drives towards the exit and the victim begins running across the lot exit to the other side, where he attempts to take shelter in the grass. As he's walking in the grass, away from the Chevy, the Chevy drives over the curb, onto the grass, accelerates aggressively and strikes the victim with the front of his vehicle. The video depicts the victim going under the vehicle after he is struck and he appears to get dragged under the vehicle, before lying still in the middle of the street.

Based on the defendant's violent conduct that caused the death of another person, an arrest warrant is sought.
