The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 11/13/2023 at 1550 hours, Patrol Officers with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department responded to [REDACTED], Jackson County, Missouri, in regard to a shooting.

The responding officers were already in the area on a call for service and heard approximately fifteen to twenty sounds of shots to the east of their location, and a car speeding off in an unknown direction. The officers completed the call and began to head east. The officers were notified of a call for service at [REDACTED] involving a person being shot.

Upon arrival officers located the Victim, a teenage black male, laying in the front yard on the walkway leading to the front porch. The officers attempted to render aid. Paramedics with the Kansas City Missouri Fire Department arrived and transported the Victim to Research Medical Center. The Victim was declared deceased at the medical center at 1612 hours.

Officers had several of the Victim's family members exit the residence. An initial area canvass was conducted and multiple shell casings were located in the street on the westside of the residence. Several surveillance cameras were observed affixed to the residence. The Victim's sister (Witness #1), who had been in the residence, was contacted and confirmed that the cameras were operational and she could access the system from her cellphone.

Homicide Detectives and Crime Scene Investigators responded to the scene.

The scene of the homicide was processed by Kansas City Missouri Police Department Crime Scene Technicians. The Crime Scene Technicians located ten 9mm shell casings in the street and eleven 300 blackout shell casings in the front yard.

One camera was affixed to the front of the house, facing south with a direct view of the front yard. A second camera was located on the west wall of the house, facing south with a clear view of the intersection of [REDACTED] Street and [REDACTED]. Witness#1 accessed the footage via her cell phone. An officer reviewed part of the footage from both cameras and observed that approximately ten minutes prior to the sounds of shots heard by officers, the Victim could be seen on camera standing in the front yard. At 1546 hours, a newer model red Dodge Charger with a black roof and black wheels was observed driving northbound through the intersection of [REDACTED], which is along the west corner of the residence. At 1548 hours, the red Charger can be seen slowly approaching the intersection from the north. It was observed the front and back driver's windows were rolled down. Suspects fired multiple rounds from the Charger at the residence and the Victim. It was also observed that a rear passenger placed both hands on the rear door. The Charger left the scene southbound on Jackson Avenue at a high rate of speed.

Officers provided a description of the Charger, at which time KCPD Dispatchers were able to broadcast the information to other officers that were working within city limits.

A copy of the surveillance footage was recovered by Detectives and reviewed.

It was later determined the Victim had fired an AR-Rifle during the incident. This accounted for the 300 Blackout shell casings in the front yard of the residence. After the review of the surveillance video was conducted, it was observed the rifle was removed from the scene by a black male prior to the arrival of the responding officers.

On 11/13/2023 at 1649 hours, officers located the Charger in the parking lot of [REDACTED]. The officers observed two black males standing by the Charger. As officers arrived on scene and attempted to make contact, both black males ran from the scene which initiated a foot pursuit. Both black males were taken into custody and arrested. It was determined the Charger had been listed earlier in the day as a stolen vehicle from Claycomo, Missouri. The males were later identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. It was also observed that the Charger's rear driver's side tire was flat and had apparent damage consistent with bullet strikes.

On 11/13/2023, detectives conducted a search using the Genetec camera system in an attempt to track the movements of the Charger and the suspects. The Charger was located on surveillance footage at the [REDACTED], at 1633 hours. It was determined that two black males were seen exiting the Charger and attempting to inflate the rear driver's side tire. The one male was identified as [REDACTED] by his clothing. The other male was identified as [REDACTED] by his clothing and observations of his face when he entered the store to get change.

On 11/14/2023, Detectives with the Homicide Unit responded to the Metro Detention Unit and contacted [REDACTED]. A search warrant was executed for a DNA sample from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] then refused to provide a further statement and requested legal representation.

Also, on 11/14/2023, Detectives with the Homicide Unit conducted an interview with [REDACTED]. A search warrant was executed for a DNA sample from [REDACTED]. He then provided a statement in which he admitted to purchasing

the Dodge Charger earlier in the day for two hundred dollars. He knew the Charger was stolen. He continued to give a timeline of his day and explained that he picked up two of his “brothers” in the Charger in the morning. He acknowledged that one of the “brothers” was [REDACTED], but refused to identify the other “brother”.

He drove around with the two “brothers” and eventually the two “brothers” wanted to go spend time with some younger girls at a house. [REDACTED] did not want to go with them, so he was dropped off at a house on [REDACTED] (near the intersection on [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] said he was at the house on [REDACTED] Street from sometime after two in the afternoon to between four or five in the afternoon.

When the “brothers” returned with the Charger, [REDACTED] noticed that the back window was broken and one of the tires was flat. [REDACTED] kept asking what happened, but the two “brothers” would not give him an answer. Allen got mad and dropped off one “brother” at the apartments near [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], but [REDACTED] stayed with him until they were arrested.

A Detective conducted research in an attempt to identify a possible residence that [REDACTED] could have gone to in the area of [REDACTED]. The Detective was not able to confirm a connection between [REDACTED] and any current residents in that area. No persons came forward to provide an alibi for [REDACTED] for the time period of when the homicide occurred.

On 12/28/2023, a homicide Detective was contacted by a Detective with the Overland Park Police Department. The Overland Park Detective explained that a woman named [REDACTED] had been arrested in Overland Park. At the time of the arrest, she had been a passenger in a stolen Dodge, along with [REDACTED] and another black male. [REDACTED] informed the Overland Park Detective that she had information about the Kansas City homicide and wanted to speak to a Detective. The homicide Detective responded to the [REDACTED] and conducted an interview with [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] provided the following statement: On 11/13/2023, she was with her boyfriend at the time, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] received a call from his friend SirMichael (Harbin), after he heard the Victim had been killed. [REDACTED] admitted that he along with [REDACTED] had been in the red Charger and had killed the Victim. SirMichael said, “We did that. That’s 356 heat”. [REDACTED] was asked to clarify if [REDACTED] told her this, or if she heard SirMichael speaking. [REDACTED] admitted overhearing his ([REDACTED] phone conversation, because she was in the room with [REDACTED]. SirMichael told [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had dropped him off after the homicide. Also, that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had been arrested at a tire store before they could sell the Charger. Brewster added [REDACTED] had thrown a gun before he was arrested and he later found out that a little kid was posting pictures of the gun on an unknown social media site. After [REDACTED] was released he got the gun back.

[REDACTED] had been told the Victim had claimed to kill a boy named [REDACTED] and the Victim’s homicide was in retaliation.

[REDACTED] admitted that she personally knew [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

██████████ was also able to identify ██████████ (██████████ as living in the River Park Townhomes at 5813 East 40th Terrace. She was able to confirm the location due to having been there. She explained that would be where ██████████ ██████████-██████████ and Harbin had gone prior to and after the homicide was committed.

██████████ explained that ██████████ had been in detention with ██████████ and ██████████

knew [REDACTED] was dating and staying with a girl named [REDACTED]

SirMichael Harbin was arrested on 11/14/2024 along with Essex- Benjamin for an unrelated weapons offense and an interview was conducted with Harbin about the weapons offense and the homicide.

██████████ was the victim of a homicide on 02/13/2024.

██████████ was the victim of a homicide on 09/03/2024.

On 11/14/2024, an Assault Squad Detective and a Homicide Detective conducted an interview with Harbin at the Jackson County Detention Center.

During the interview the Homicide Detective served a search warrant for Harbin's buccal swab. The Detective confirmed with Harbin and made sure he understood the buccal swab would be used to develop his DNA standard, and the standard would be used to compare with collected evidence in investigations.

The interview continued and Harbin acknowledged that his birthday was November 12th, 2005. The Homicide Detective then inquired what he did for his birthday (2024). Harbin explained he had spent time with his family. The Homicide Detective asked what he did last year (2023) for his birthday and he replied, his “sister” [REDACTED] ruined his birthday. Harbin explained a house had been rented on Air-bnb, but before he got there, a disturbance occurred and everyone had been kicked out of the rented house. Harbin admitted he had known some girls who lived in the apartment complex at [REDACTED] in 2023. Harbin acknowledged he had been dating and staying with a girl named [REDACTED] in 2023. He also clarified the iPhone he had at the time of his arrest was not the same iPhone he had in 2023.

When asked to go through what he had done on November 13th, 2023, Harbin provided specific information stating he had seen [REDACTED] [REDACTED] for approximately ten minutes in the morning at [REDACTED] house. Harbin then stated he went to [REDACTED] house and stayed there all day into the evening. At approximately ten at night, he went to his [REDACTED] house.

The Homicide Detective then asked him the following direct questions and his responses;
Have you ever been in a red and black Charger with [REDACTED] or [REDACTED]
No.

Where were you last year on November 13th, 2023?

Probably at a friend's house.

What friend?

Did you talk to [REDACTED] that day?

I don't know, probably.

No idea who hit [REDACTED]

Shook his head indicating, no.

Did [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] ever say what happened with [REDACTED]

No.

On the day after your birthday last year did you have a gun? No guns, no rifles, no .223's, no 9mm?

No. I didn't have a gun. Me personally.

Did you know [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

No.

Did [REDACTED] know him, did [REDACTED] know him, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

I don't know.

Did you see [REDACTED] [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] [REDACTED] - [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] house on November 13th, 2023?

No.

Did you see [REDACTED] [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] [REDACTED] - [REDACTED] in a red and black Charger on November 13th, 2023?

No sir.

Were you in possession of any type of a firearm on November 13th, 2023?

No.

Would you have had any reason to be at the intersection of [REDACTED] Avenue on November 13th, 2023? At any time on that day?

No. Not at all.

No video or pictures are going to put you there?

No.

No DNA, no fingerprints are going to put you there?

No.

Why would you tell [REDACTED] that you needed to play it cool for a year, because that's how long cops look at shit?

No, I don't recall saying that.

Was anyone else at [REDACTED] house when you were there?

No, besides [REDACTED] ([REDACTED] mother).

Do you know anyone who steals cars?

No.

Have you ever stolen cars?

No, I've been in stolen cars.

Did you get caught?

Ya, that was with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] was there (Juvenile Detention).

Is your memory good or bad? Are you good with details?

It's cool. Ya

The interview was concluded after Harbin stopped answering questions.

On 02/09/2024, A search warrant was applied for and granted for Harbin's iCloud account and the records and data provided by Apple was reviewed.

On 11/19/2024, a Detective conducted a second review of Harbin's iCloud account, which was done after the Detective conducted the interview with Harbin. The review was done to determine if there was any additional information that could be located within the iCloud records and data to compare to the information that had been located in [REDACTED] - [REDACTED] cell phone download.

The Detective located a picture of Harbin and [REDACTED] - [REDACTED] holding an AR-Rifle and pistols in a room with unfinished drywall. The same picture had been located in a download of [REDACTED] - [REDACTED] cell phone. In the same download from [REDACTED] - [REDACTED] cell phone a timeline file provided date, times, and geolocations for 11/13/2023:

On 02/07/2025, a Detective received results from the Kansas City Police Crime Laboratory which provide information for two recovered DNA swabs from the interior of the Dodge Charger that had been recovered. The DNA swabs had been processed and compared to Harbin's DNA profile that had been developed from his recovered buccal swab. The DNA swab (item #63) from the right front interior door handle showed very strong support for Harbin as the contributor. The DNA swab (item #64) from the recovered water bottle showed very strong support for Harbin as the contributor.

On 03/06/2025, Detectives conducted an interview with [REDACTED] e at his residence.

[REDACTED] acknowledged he has been friends with [REDACTED] for several years. [REDACTED] also acknowledged he had been friends for several years with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] prior to their deaths.

When asked if he remembered what he was doing on November 13th 2023 and who he was with, he responded that was the day after [REDACTED] birthday. [REDACTED] had spent the day (11/12/2023) with SirMichael for his birthday. He did not remember if he was with SirMichael on the 13th of November, but did not think so. He denied that [REDACTED] came to his residence on November 13th in a black and red Dodge Charger. He denied knowing [REDACTED].

On 06/17/2025, a Detective received a report from the Kansas City Police Crime Laboratory. The report identified SirMichael Harbin as a contributor for the following evidence. DNA swab of Blazer 9mm Luger casings from the street mid-block on [REDACTED]. SirMichael Harbin was identified as a DNA contributor with a greater than 1 billion likelihood. M [REDACTED] were excluded as contributors.

A Detective has identified SirMichael Harbin as the third suspect of the homicide based on the following: [REDACTED] acknowledging that he was with two of his "brothers" on the day of the homicide. [REDACTED] statement identifying [REDACTED] and SirMichael Harbin as the suspects. [REDACTED] providing information regarding SirMichael Harbin, while speaking with [REDACTED], stated he was with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at the time of the homicide, stating, "We did that. That's 356 heat". SirMichael Harbin stating in his interview he had not been in a red and black Dodge Charger with [REDACTED] the day of the homicide being contradicted by DNA evidence. SirMichael Harbin stating in his interview that he did not possess a firearm being contradicted by the picture of him with [REDACTED] holding AR-Rifles and pistols and being arrested and charged for a weapons violation in an unrelated incident. The geolocation data from [REDACTED] cell phone data, which placed him at the homicide and at [REDACTED] residence after the homicide occurred which contradicted SirMichael Harbin's statement that he had only seen [REDACTED] in the morning of 11/13/2023. DNA evidence identifying SirMichael Harbin as a contributor on a 9mm casing located at the scene.

The underlying offense is related to a serious felony currently being investigated by Kansas City Missouri Police Department which is punishable by significant penalties that incentivize the defendant to fail to appear.
