The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 09-10-2025, at approximately 1743hrs, officers with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department were patrolling in the area of E Linwood Boulevard and Bellefontaine Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri when they observed what appeared to be a motor vehicle accident. A black male, later identified as Tyrin Mosby-Sherman (suspect) was observed standing near the driver's side door of an Audi A5 (which was crashed into the back of the first vehicle, a white SUV), and was then observed to be walking toward the rear driver's side door. Officers then conducted a "U-turn" at the intersection of E Linwood Boulevard and Benton Boulevard to investigate the possible accident. Officers then observed Tyrin pull a small child, later identified as [Redacted], from the vehicle. Officers then observed Tyrin flee eastbound from the accident while holding [Redacted] hand. Officers observed a skinny black object protruding from the front right pocket of Tyrin's jacket, which they believed to be an extended magazine belonging to a firearm.

Tyrin fled north on foot towards E 31st Street, and was running between houses, while holding [Redacted] hand and making him run with him. An officer pursued Tyrin on foot, eventually catching up to him, and giving verbal commands to lay on the ground in the driveway of 3112 Bellefontaine Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. Tyrin laid on the ground with [Redacted] underneath his body. Tyrin was instructed by officers to release [Redacted] to the police, at which point he told them "He can't do that", and "he won't". Tyrin let go of [Redacted] and began to let him walk towards the officers. He then grabbed [Redacted] again and was once again instructed to release him. Tyrin eventually released [Redacted], and an officer was able to get [Redacted] away safely. Officers then approached Tyrin and safely took him into custody. A .40 caliber Glock handgun (S/N BMBW596) with a 30-round extended magazine (23 total rounds) was removed from Tyrin's jacket pocket for officer safety purposes. When the Glock was removed from Tyrin's pocket a pill bottle also fell out onto the ground. Officers observed six blue pills inside the pill bottle. Officers also observed four cellphones and 3 vehicle key fobs (2 Ford, 1 Audi, 1 Chevrolet) on the ground where Tyrin was taken into custody.

An officer conducted a search incident to arrest of Tyrin and located \$910 in his left pocket, and eighty-three Suboxone tablets in his right pocket.

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A computer check of the Audi A5's [REDACTED] that Tyrin was observed standing next to and removing [REDACTED] from, showed the vehicle was stolen out of Kansas City, Missouri. The stolen vehicle was documented under KC CRN 25-054195. The owner of the vehicle is [REDACTED]. An inventory search of the Audi prior to its tow to the City Tow Lot was conducted and officers located clear sandwich baggies, a sandwich bag box, and one Suboxone tablet in the compartment under the steering wheel. There were no car seats or booster seats inside the vehicle. The Audi A5 was towed due to disabling damage as a result of the accident.

The six pills that were located in the pill bottle that fell out of Tyrin's pocket were transported to East Patrol for further testing. Presumptive testing utilizing the TruNarc device indicated the presence of Oxycodone in three of the pills. The other three pills tested inconclusive. Officers then used Drugs.com to assist in identifying the three unknown pills by searching the pill markings. The three pills were identified as Alprazolam.

On 09-11-2025 detectives with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department Juvenile Section responded to Metro Detention to speak with Tyrin. He was escorted to an interview room where he was read aloud his Miranda Warning. He agreed to provide a statement. Tyrin stated he and [REDACTED] were walking down a side street when an officer spotted them. The officer probably saw his Glock's extended magazine sticking out of his pocket, and that his why they decided to stop him. He never ran from the police; they must have seen someone else running with [REDACTED]. He did obey their commands to get on the ground, and when he did, [REDACTED] was underneath his body. The reason he grabbed [REDACTED] back to himself was because he was scared. He did eventually let go of [REDACTED] and allowed him to go to the officers. Aside from the Glock being on him he did have Oxycodone pills on him because he was shot several years ago. He was prescribed them by a doctor. The reason the pill bottle doesn't have his name on it is because he peeled off the sticker because he is always dropping stuff, and he doesn't want someone finding his name and address. He was never in a car accident, and was never around, nor in, an Audi A5. He understands how walking around with prescription medication, a firearm with an extended magazine, and \$910 cash could endanger [REDACTED] welfare. He also understands how his actions could place [REDACTED] in a high level of endangerment.
