**COMPLAINT
WARRANT REQUESTED**

**Count I. Endangering The Welfare Of A Child Creating Substantial Risk- 1st Degree
- 1st Offense - No Sexual Conduct (568.045-005Y20203806.0)**

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 568.045, RSMo, committed the class D felony of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about September 10, 2025, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly acted in a manner that created a substantial risk to the life, body and health of [REDACTED], a child less than seventeen years of age, by keeping [REDACTED] with him during an armed standoff.

The range punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

**Count II. Resisting Arrest/Detention/Stop By Fleeing - Creating A Substantial Risk
Of Serious Injury/Death To Any Person (575.150-002Y20204801.0)**

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 575.150, RSMo, committed the **class E felony of resisting a lawful detention**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about September 10, 2025, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, Officer Church, a law enforcement officer, was attempting to make a lawful detention of defendant, and the defendant knew or reasonably should have known that the officer was making a lawful detention, and, for the purpose of preventing the officer from effecting the detention, resisted the detention of defendant by fleeing from the officer and defendant fled in such a manner that created a substantial risk of serious physical injury or death to [REDACTED] in that defendant prevented [REDACTED] from exiting an armed standoff with police.

The range punishment for a class E felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed four (4) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count III. Leaving Scene Of Accident - Property Damage Exceeding \$1,000 (577.060-002Y20205401.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 577.060, RSMo, committed the class E felony of leaving the scene of an accident, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about September 10, 2025, the defendant, while operating a motor vehicle on a street generally open for use by the public located at or near E. Linwood Boulevard and Bellefontaine Avenue, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, was involved in an accident that resulted in damage to the property of [REDACTED] in excess of one thousand dollars, and the defendant knew that such accident had occurred, and the defendant left the place of the accident without stopping and giving defendant's name, residential address, license number of defendant's vehicle, and operator's license number to a police officer in the vicinity or to the nearest police station or judicial officer.

The range punishment for a class E felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed four (4) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count IV. Tampering With Motor Vehicle - 1st Degree (569.080-002Y20202902.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 569.080.1(2), RSMo, committed the class D felony of tampering in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 558.002, RSMo, in that on or about September 10, 2025, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly and without the consent of the owner possessed a blue 2018 Audi A5, an automobile.

The range punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.
